Kim describes her job as one that can be "one of the most dangerous but also one of the safest". Her primary duty is taking care of roadside bombs. While they try to use robots, sometimes they must go "face to face with the device" to disarm it. SPC Schoonover believes that "every time we take care of an IED, one more soldier can go home to their family at the end of their tour." EOD Techs make up less than 1% of the soldiers in the US Army. They are truly the unsung heroes as many people don't realize the Army "Bomb Squad" is out there everyday disarming explosive devices.

SPC Schoonover will return to Ft. Bragg NC in May of 2009 upon completion of her current tour.

Married and Serving in Iraq



SPC Evans is a graduate of Tonasket High School and is currently serving his 2nd tour of duty in Iraq. He is married to SPC Kimberly Schoonover who is also currently serving in Iraq.

He is assigned to a battalion of the 82nd Airborne Division in the forward operating base of Adder, Iraq. Adder is located near the ancient city of Ur. It is the oldest city in the world and the birthplace of Abraham.

SPC Evans primary duty is Civil Military Operations (CMO). He interfaces with local Iraqi officials and civilians, helping to rebuild local government infrastructures and gain local support against the insurgency by using indirect means. This can include doing humanitarian aid missions, supervising the building of roads, schools and hospitals. He also conducts foot patrols in the local area as a way to meet locals.

SPC Evans "feels lucky" to have been selected for CMO duty. It is a highly visible position and requires interaction with not only high ranking US military and civilian officials, but also Iraqi civilian and military leaders.

Women Veterans in WA State honored during Red, White and Blue Night with the Seattle Storm

Olympia – On May 20, 2008, Women Military Veterans in Washington State will be honored during “Red, White and Blue Night” with the Seattle Storm.
